EQUAL EDUCATION OPPORTUNITY

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to ensure that equal educational opportunity is provided for all students of Marine Village School.

II. GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY

- A. It is the school's policy to provide equal educational opportunity for all students. The school does not unlawfully discriminate on the basis of race, color, creed, religion, national origin, sex, marital status, parental status, status with regard to public assistance, disability, sexual orientation or age. The school also makes reasonable accommodations for disabled students.
- B. The school will identify, evaluate and provide an appropriate public education to learners who are disabled within the definition of Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973.
- C. The school prohibits the harassment of any individual for any of the categories listed above. For information about the types of conduct that constitute violation of the school's policy on harassment and violence and the school's procedures for addressing such complaints, refer to the school's policy on harassment and violence.
- D. This policy applies to all areas of education including academics, coursework, co-curricular and extracurricular activities, or other rights or privileges of enrollment.
- E. It is the responsibility of every school employee to comply with this policy conscientiously.
- F. Any student, parent or guardian having any questions regarding this policy should discuss it with the appropriate school official as provided by policy.
