### Why am I interested in a board position?

### **Why am I interested in a board position?**

Since moving to Marine 2.5 years ago, I have been “wowed” again and again by this incredible community and its dedicated volunteers. I'm now looking for the right way to give back to this community, searching for an opportunity that will leverage my skills/experience/energy in meaningful ways. When I learned that the MVS was looking for new board members, I thought this might be a good fit; now, after researching the opportunity, including talking with several current/former staff and board members, I've decided that yes, I'd like to serve the community in this way. Why? I've always had a passion for education; my parents were both teachers and at one point I considered pursuing an EdS.
